February 1, 2011 Seeds and Seedy Saturdays

Attending my local Seedy Saturday always seems like me the real beginning of spring. That, and starting my leeks, sweet onions and celeriac seedlings indoors in mid-February.

Which reminds me of something to do right now: Check germination of old seeds. I check on onions and corn older than 2 years, other seeds older than 4 or 5 years. Just count out 5, 10 or 20 seeds, depending on how many you have left. Fold them into a moist paper towel. Put the towel in a loosely closed plastic bag or container to keep the paper moist and check daily. In a few days, the tiny white tip of a root will start to poke out of the viable seeds. Count the sprouted vs. non-sprouted seeds and figure out the percentage germination. It is a good idea to buy new seeds if germinations falls below 50% or make a note to save a new batch of seeds this year.
